

## **NJ/PA College Students Voting Options**

### **Voting in Pennsylvania**

To vote in Pennsylvania, you must first register to vote at least 15 days before the election. You can register to vote online, by mail, or at a number of government agencies, including Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) Photo License and Driver's License Centers.

### **Voting for College Students**

Students in Pennsylvania may register to vote in their school's district if they wish to vote in local elections. Alternatively, they may remain registered on their parents' address and vote in home district elections using an absentee ballot.

You have the right to register and vote where you live while attending college in Pennsylvania. You can use either an on-campus or off-campus address.

### **Voter Eligibility**

To vote in Pennsylvania you must:

- be a citizen of the United States at 30 days before Election Day
- be a resident of Pennsylvania and your election district at least 30 days before Election Day
- be 18 years old by Election Day
- not be incarcerated after conviction for a felony (your voting rights are restored immediately after incarceration)

### **Residency Requirements**

Pennsylvania voters must reside in the same voting district for at least 30 days prior to the next election date in order to register in that district.

### **Voter Registration Deadlines**

Online registration deadline: Monday, October 21, 2024

Register by mail deadline: Must be received by Monday, October 21, 2024

In person registration deadline: Monday, October 21, 2024

### **WHAT THIS MEANS if you want to vote in PA for the 2024 General Election**

1. You must meet all the Voter Eligibility requirements, AND
2. You must be living in PA as of October 6, 2024 (at least 30 days prior to Election Day - November 5, 2024), AND
3. You must be registered at this PA address on or before October 21, 2024.

### **WHY you should consider voting in PA instead of NJ.**

Pennsylvania has competitive races that can determine the Presidency, Senate and House. In the presidential race, Kamala Harris needs [PA's 19 electoral votes](#). [Senator Bob Casey](#) [D] is up for re-election and must win. There are [four congressional seats](#) in Pennsylvania that can be flipped either way. PA10 around Harrisburg is within reach of flipping red to blue.
